## **I. GENERAL PROVISIONS**

### **1. Goals and objectives of mastering the academic discipline (module)**

**The goals of mastering the academic discipline** "Industrial practice: research work. Research seminar No. 2" are:

- strengthening the research component in the process of studying under the master's program;
- development of research competencies and corresponding practical skills for independent search, analysis and application of doctrinal and regulatory sources in the field of legal regulation of the global economy;
- preparation for writing a master's thesis and other research papers in the field of legal regulation of private law cross-border relations.

**The main tasks of the discipline:**

1. Mastering a systematic approach to conducting research on legal issues.
2. Development of skills in developing methodology, organizing and conducting scientific research, mastering methods of collecting and analyzing data, formulating hypotheses, setting scientific goals and research objectives.
3. Discussion of projects and completed research papers.
4. Development of skills for teamwork, conducting scientific discussions and presenting research results.

### **1.2. The place of the academic discipline (module) in the structure of the core educational programme of higher education**

Academic discipline (module) "Industrial practice: research work. Research seminar No. 2" refers to section Б2.В "Practice and research work" of the main educational program of higher professional education.

Mastering an academic discipline (module) provides an opportunity to expand and deepen the knowledge obtained at the previous stage of training, to acquire skills and abilities determined by the content of the program. Competencies that are formed in the process of mastering an academic discipline (module) are necessary for successful professional activity, continuing education under the program for training highly qualified personnel. ### *Questions for preparation:*

1. Features of scientific work and ethics of scientific work.

3. Scientific study as the main form of scientific work.
4. Scientific foresight as a type of cognitive activity.
5. Types of scientific research.
6. Methods of scientific knowledge.

### *Tasks for independent work:*

1. Presentation of scientific work in the form of an article in a journal or at a scientific conference.

2. Applied research.
3. Ethics of scientific work.
4. Categories and concepts of scientific work.
5. Scientific foresight as a type of cognitive activity.
6. Preliminary research, verification research studies, fundamental research.
7. Methods of scientific knowledge.

**Practical lesson 2.** "Methodology of scientific research" - 2 academic hours for full-time education, 1 academic hour for correspondence education

***Questions for preparation:***

1. Logical laws and their application in international private law.
2. Inferences and their main types.
3. Logical rules of argumentation.
4. Ways to refute your opponent's arguments.
5. Methodological apparatus of dissertation research.

***Tasks for independent work***

In accordance with the topic of the master's thesis, prepare answers to the following questions:

1. Basic laws of logic (identity, contradiction, excluded middle, sufficient reason).

Provide examples of the use of laws of logic in a master's thesis.

2. Definition of a concept. Content and scope of a concept. Limitation and generalization of a concept. Generic and specific concepts. Rules for constructing a concept (definition). Basic errors in creating a definition (disproportion; "circle in definition", presence of negation, ambiguity, etc.).

Provide examples of definitions used in the master's thesis. Create your own definition of the concept used in the thesis.

3. The concept and types of inferences (deductive, inductive, by analogy). The structure and content of the syllogism. The axiom of the syllogism. Enthymeme.

Provide examples of the use of syllogisms and enthymemes in a master's thesis.

4. Inductive reasoning. Types of induction (complete, incomplete, scientific, etc.) Construction of inductive reasoning. Methods of studying the causal relationship of phenomena (similarities, differences, residues, accompanying changes).

Provide examples of the use of inductive reasoning in a master's thesis.

5. Concept and types of hypotheses. Testing a hypothesis. Hypothesis and theory.

Provide examples of the use of hypotheses in a master's thesis.

6. Definition of logical proof. Composition of proof (thesis, basis and method). Direct and indirect proofs. Rules of logical proof (certainty, identity, sufficiency, validity, etc.).

Provide examples of the use of evidence in a master's thesis, identify their

components and compliance with the rules of evidence.

**7. Refutation. Methods of refutation.**

Provide examples of the use of refutations in a master's thesis.

**8. A comparative analysis of the syllogisms of Ulric Huber and Joseph Story.**

Three Maxims of Ulrik Huber:

(1) The laws of every state have force only within the limits of the authority of the government concerned, and also over all persons subject to it, but not beyond these limits.

(2) All persons permanently or temporarily residing in the territory subject to the given government are considered subject to it.

(3) Sovereigns shall, on the principle of international comity, act in such a way that rights acquired within the authority of one government shall retain their force everywhere, provided that they do not prejudice the powers or rights of such government or the persons subject to it.

Three maxims of Joseph Story:

"The first and most general maxim (guiding principle) is, that every nation has exclusive sovereignty and jurisdiction within its own territory. The direct consequence of this rule is, that the laws of every state shall be valid with respect to all property, both real and personal, within its territory, and to all persons who are residents in that territory, whether subjects born there or foreigners, and to all contracts and acts made there..."

The second maxim, which follows naturally from the first, is that no State can claim that its law extends to property or persons outside its territory.

The third maxim is that if certain laws do receive extraterritorial force, it is solely by the free will of the territorial authority.

**9.** Logical analysis of the definition: "The law of the closest connection means the application of the law of the state with which the private legal relationship is most closely connected."

3. The relationship between the sections of the main part of the work and the research topic as parts and the whole. The division of the chapters of the main part into paragraphs.
4. Functional-syntactic means of communication.
5. Special terminology. Phraseology of scientific prose. Syntax of scientific speech. Speech redundancy.
6. Speech function and lexical means.
7. Definitions of an evaluative nature.

**Practical lesson 5. "Design of the dissertation work"**- 2 academic hours for full-time education, 1 academic hour for part-time education

***Questions for preparation:***

1. Presentation of tabular material.
2. Processing of individual types of text.
3. Use of quotations and registration of borrowings.
4. Use of diagrams and drawings.
5. Work on the bibliographic apparatus.
6. Compilation of appendices and notes.
7. Rules for reprinting the manuscript.

***Tasks for independent work:***

1. Ordinal number, subject heading and content of table columns.
2. References, footnotes and abbreviations in the text.
3. Academic etiquette. Direct and indirect quotations. Fair and unfair borrowings.
4. Use of diagrams and drawings.
5. Bibliographic list of the dissertation (international legal acts, regulatory

legal acts of the Russian Federation and foreign countries, legal customs, materials of legal practice, list of literature, Internet sites).

6. Compilation of appendices and notes.
7. Approximate volume of the dissertation. Font size, line spacing, margins, etc.

***Practical lesson 6. "Presentation of scientific research" - 2 academic hours for full-time education, 1 academic hour for part-time education***

***Tasks for independent work:***

3. Structure and content of the presentation.
4. Development of a methodology for presenting the material and selection of illustrative design.
5. Selection of software implementation tools.
6. Developing a presentation scenario plan.
7. Conducting a presentation.

## **2.4. Independent work**

Independent work is carried out in the form of studying primary and additional literature, regulatory materials, judicial practice, and business practices of various organizations.

**Types of independent work:**

- search and study of legal acts, including the use of electronic databases;
- search and study of scientific literature, including using the Internet;
- search and study of judicial practice on specific issues,
- search and study of business practices of various organizations;
- preparation of messages, presentations;
- drafting business documents (agreements, unilateral documents, etc.),
- completing written assignments (drawing up diagrams, tables).

**Model (features) of independent work on individual sections and topics:**

- study of educational literature, other legal literature on the relevant topic;
- study of regulatory acts on the relevant topic;

- analysis of judicial acts on the relevant topic;
- preparation of written assignments;
- preparation for discussion of controversial issues or highlighting problems;
- drawing up diagrams, comparative tables;
- study of additional topics determined in agreement with the teacher (optional).

Model (features) of independent work of correspondence students:

- independent planning of time for studying topics during the semester;
- study of educational and other legal literature based on the list of literature in the program;
- study of regulatory acts on the relevant topic;
- study of recommended judicial practice;
- preparation of written assignments;
- preparation for practical classes;
- study of additional topics determined in agreement with the teacher (optional).

## **V. LOGISTICS AND SOFTWARE SUPPORT FOR THE DISCIPLINE (MODULE)**

### **5.1. Providing the educational process with other library and information resources and means of providing the educational process**

Students are provided with access (remote access) to modern professional databases and information reference systems. The full-text work program of the academic discipline (module) is posted in the Digital Scientific, Educational and Social Network of the University (hereinafter referred to as the DSES), in the system of which the "Electronic personal accounts of the student and scientific and pedagogical worker" operate. Access to materials is possible by entering an individual password. The DSES is designed to create a personality-oriented information and communication environment that ensures information interaction of all participants in the educational process of Kutafin University (MSAL), including providing them with publicly available and personalized reference, scientific, educational, social information through services operating on the basis of applied information systems of Kutafin University (MSAL).

Each student is provided with individual unlimited access to the electronic library systems (electronic libraries) and the electronic information and educational environment of Kutafin University (MSAL) throughout the entire period of study. In addition to the electronic libraries of Kutafin University (MSAL), he is provided with individual unlimited access to all remote electronic library systems, databases and reference and legal systems connected to Kutafin University (MSAL) on the basis of license agreements, and having adapted versions of sites for students with disabilities.

The electronic library system (electronic library) and the electronic information and educational environment provide the possibility of simultaneous access for 100 percent of students from any point where there is access to the information and telecommunications network "Internet", both on the territory of Kutafin University (MSAL) and outside it. In case of absence of the publication in

the electronic library system (electronic library), the library fund of Kutafin University (MSAL) is equipped with printed publications of at least 50 copies of each of the publications of the required literature listed in the working programs of disciplines (modules), practices, and at least 25 copies of additional literature per 100 students.

Kutafin Moscow State Law University (MSAL) has a material and technical base that complies with the current fire safety rules and regulations and ensures the implementation of all types of disciplinary and interdisciplinary training, practical and research work of students, as provided for by the curriculum.

The implementation of the discipline (module) involves classrooms for conducting lecture-type classes, seminar-type classes, group and individual consultations, ongoing monitoring and midterm assessment, as well as rooms for independent work and rooms for storing and preventive maintenance of educational equipment. For conducting lecture-type classes, students are offered sets of demonstration equipment and educational visual aids that provide thematic illustrations that are stored on electronic media.
